## **Recipe of the Month**

Strawberry Sour Cream Salad from Dot Carter

Ingredients

- 2 small pkgs of strawberry gelatin
- 2 cups boiling water
- 210-ounce pkgs of frozen strawberries
- 11/2 cups of crushed pineapple (drained)
- 2 large bananas
- 18-ounce tub of sour cream
- 1 cup chopped nuts

Dissolve gelatine in water and add berries, pineapple, and bananas. Pour 1/2 of the mixture into a 9X13 dish. Chill until firm. Spoon sour cream over gelatin and spread evenly. Cover with the remainder of gelatin (which has been sitting at room temperature). Then chill overnight. Cut into squares. Serve on a platter with lettuce garnish with a dab of sour cream, if you wish.
